CAT ACT 2011 – Requirements

STERILISATION/MICROCHIPPING

The owner of a cat that has reached 6 months of age must ensure that the cat is sterilised by a veterinarian unless that the cat is exempt under the Act from Sterilisation. The veterinarian is required by law to provide a certificate of sterilisation and to notify the microchip database company within 7 days of the cat being sterilised. **\$5,000 fine will apply to anyone incorrectly identifying a cat as being sterilised.**

BREEDING OF CATS

A person may not breed cats unless the person is an approved cat breeder.
Penalty: \$5,000 fine for non-compliance.

REGISTRATION AND TAGGING

The owner of a cat that has reached 6 months of age must ensure that the cat is registered with the local government in whose district the cat is originally kept. **Penalty: \$5,000 fine non-compliance.**
Cats must be;

- Microchipped; and
- Sterilised (unless exempt under the Act)

Applicants must be;

- Over the age of 18
- Not convicted within the previous 3 years or convicted of 2 or more offences against
The Cat Act 2011 – The Dog Act 1976 – The Animal Welfare Act 2002
